(IF A LINK ON MY PAGE IS NOT WORKING YOU NEED TO TELL ME!!! The NYTimes and WashPost links are sometimes limited to a number of access attempts a day – you may get to read three from either source before you are prompted to buy access. I'd read as many as you can and then come back another day!)

You will most likely find yourself doing even more research, and you MAY include those in the annotated bib, but you do not HAVE to. You NEED to use the MLA style of citation for each text/video you annotate. There is a link to OWL at Purdue on my website – know that anything from the website needs to include WHSRoets.weebly.com as the "container."
