Use the quote as a lens or starting point to address a “hot” issue of the day; the goal here is to use ethical rhetoric in a Rogerian mode – you want to “change the mood” in order to change a mind. Start with where you and your audience might share a point of view, and then move to persuade. Pay particular attention to your balance of appeals. Consider the WHS community as your audience. MLA format and citation style required.
